We are looking forward to a positive term with a continued focus on our three school plan priorities:

Success for all Students

In Week 3 the National Assessment Program, Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be conducted with Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students across Australia.

Classroom programs continue to be focussed on a rigorous approach to whole school priorities in English and Mathematics.

In addition, we have a focus on Digital Technologies, a new curriculum area mandated in the Australian Curriculum from 2018, which seeks to support students' understanding of computer coding, robotics and programming. This is exciting and hands on for the students and also links to Mathematics, Science and Engineering.





Quality Teaching and Leadership

Staff continue to undertake professional learning in whole school focus areas such as working with special needs students, developing education plans, literacy and numeracy programs and more. Staff also participate in performance and development meetings and practices, such as collaboration and classroom observations.

Introducing the Zones of Regulation - Shannan Robinson

Every child experiences a wide range of emotions every day. For some children understanding these emotions and knowing what to do when they arise can be particularly challenging. The Zones of Regulation is a program designed by Occupational Therapist and Educator, Leah Kuypers which helps children to identify their feelings and learn strategies to support them to self-regulate. This is a classroom and family friendly tool which can be used to help children of all ages.

Reports

With the commencement of our new three year School Plan, we are on a quest to develop more consistent, informative and on-going methods to communicate with parents. Our aim is to develop processes where you (the parents) are able to know how your child is progressing, and what the school and you can do to help your child progress further. This year's report will look a little different from previous years'.

Over the last 9 months, teachers and admin staff have determined the core skills that are essential in English and Mathematics for Pre-Primary to Year 6. Within the Semester 1 report, these core skills will be articulated on an additional sheet enclosed within the report (see beside for an example of the core skills sheet). Your child's performance will be rated against each of these core skills. We aim to make the information you receive in reports more consistent and parent friendly. We have simplified the information, detailing where your child is in relation to other students in WA, and what further support they may need to move forward in their learning.

To streamline the process, comments in English and Mathematics will be minimal so information on the core skills insert is not repeated. Learning area comments will contain a brief comment around effort and suggestions of areas for improvement. General comments will remain the same, detailing behaviour, work habits, social interactions and any interagency programs.
