

STUDENT DRESS CODE POLICY

Updated: Term 4, 2020

As a part of the enrolment procedures at Waggrakine Primary School the parent/guardian signs the 'Dress Code for Students Policy Agreement' sheet agreeing that they will support the *Dress Code for Students Policy*. The parent/guardian may wish to modify the school dress code for religious or health reasons and is asked to negotiate needs with the Principal.

The school board believes a school dress code:

- Fosters and enhances the public image of the school
- Assists in building school pride and team spirit
- Ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities
- Encourages equity among students

Availability

- School uniforms (other than track suit pants) may be purchased from Total Uniforms from 2021. Plain, royal blue items may be purchased from other sources.
- Students whose families may experience difficulties regarding the uniform requirements are asked to discuss the situation with principal or deputy principals

When a student fails to wear the school uniform:

- The teacher queries the student regarding their uniform and sends home a reminder note with the student.
- If the student still fails to wear uniform the teacher will inform the Principal or Deputy who will send a formal letter to parents.
- If there is no improvement a Deputy or the Principal will contact the parent to discuss
- Students not following the dress code may be denied the opportunity to represent their school at official school activities, which include choir, school excursions, sporting and social events.

In 2018 the School Board endorsed a new school uniform which will be phased in over 2019 and 2020. During this time camel, faction or the new orange/blue shirts are acceptable. The logo has also changed.

During winter, plain royal blue or other plain neutral colour leggings, tights, skivvies or long sleeved T-shirt may be worn under uniform for warmth.

Excluded from the Dress Code

- Jeans, board shorts
- Singlets, tank tops, sleeveless T-Shirts
- Clothing outside school colours
- Hats other than wide brim or legionnaires style
- Graffiti on uniforms/hats
- Other footwear

Jewellery, Hair and Makeup

- Jewellery is discouraged. The school accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to jewellery. Jewellery should be unobtrusive and not represent a health or safety hazard. Facial piercing is discouraged. Jewellery should be restricted to watches, plain rings, sleepers, studs, short simple necklaces and bracelets.
- To minimise health and safety hazards long hair should be tied back
- Make up is not to be worn at school.
